Ambassador (Rtd) T.P. Sreenivasan has served in the Indian Foreign Service for 37 years.

He has nearly 20 years of experience in multilateral diplomacy and has represented India at a number of international conferences organized by the United Nations, the Commonwealth and the Nonaligned Movement. He has chaired several UN Committees and Conferences. He rose to the highest level in the Indian Foreign Service and retired in 2004.

Some of the positions he has held include, Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations, Governor for India at the International Atomic Energy Agency, Ambassador to Austria and Slovenia, Fiji, Papua New Guinea, Nauru, Vanuatu, Solomon Islands, Tuvalu, Kiribati and Tonga,

Ambassador Sreenivasan attained his BS (English) and MA (English) from the University of Kerala. He speaks both Japanese and Russian. He is presently Director General, Kerala International Centre and an adviser to 'Asianet' and produces a weekly TV programme on international issues entitled 'Videsa Vicharam'. He also contributes articles regularly to the "Asia Wall Street Journal", 'The Times of India', 'The Tribune' and 'Rediff.com'.

He is also a visiting faculty at several universities and other academic institutions as well as the Executive Director of 'IAEA 2020', a project launched by the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency.
