Overwhelming Response to Tamil Nadu Investment Conclave

The Tamil Nadu Investment Conclave organized by the Singapore Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry in collaboration with Guidance India and several Singapore government agencies was a resounding success.

Almost 300 members of the Singapore Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry and dignitaries from both the Tamil Nadu and Singapore governments attending the event.

They heard firsthand from both the visiting Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Mr MK Stalin and Singapore's Minister for Transport and Minister-in-charge of Trade Relations, Mr S Iswaran of the efforts both sides have been undertaking to boost economic ties.

Speeches were also delivered by Tamil Nadu's newly appointed Industries Minister, Dr TRB Rajaa, Mr P Kumaran, India's High Commissioner to Singapore, who gave the welcome address and Chairman of the Singapore Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Mr Neil Parekh who is giving the closing remarks.

Senior Tamil Nadu government officials were also on hand to give an overview of the investment climate in the state and preparations for the upcoming Global Investors' Meeting in January 2024.

Exchange of MOUs

One of the highlights of the Investment Conclave was the exchange of Memoranda of Understanding between agencies in Tamil Nadu and Singapore.

The first was Guidance Tamil Nadu and the Singapore Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry with Mr Neil Parekh and the MD of Guidance Tamil Nadu Mr V. Vishnu exchanging documents.

This MOU allows for both organizations to work on business delegations to one another's countries and to jointly embark on missions to explore opportunities.

The next MOU was between Singapore India partnership Office (SIPO) and State Industries Promotion Corporation of Tamil Nadu (SIPCOT).

This is for cooperation in industrial development. SIPO and SIPCOT are keen to partner on a Sustainable Industrial Park in Tamil Nadu in collaboration with Centre for Liveable Cities.

Exchanging the documents were Dr Francis Chong Senior Director of SIPO and Mr S Krishnan.

Thirdly, an MOU between FaMe TN, Startup TN and SIPO. This is a tripartite MoU on cooperations in digitalizing Micro Small and Medium Industries. The signatories were Ms Sigy Thomas Managing Director of FaMe TN, Mr Sivarajah CEO of Startup TN and Ms Chan Kah Mei Director of SIPO.

Next Hi-P, a leading contract-manufacturing provider signed an MOU with Guidance Tamil Nadu and supported by Enterprise Singapore. Hi-P plans to establish a manufacturing facility in Chengalpattu with a proposed investment of early 50 million Singapore dollars or some 312 crore rupees creating almost 700 jobs. The signatories were the Executive Chairman of Hi-P, Mr Yao Hsiao Tung and the MD of Guidance Tamil Nadu, Mr V. Vishnu.

The next MOU is between Guidance Tamil Nadu and the Singapore University of Technology and Design, SUTD. This MOU will allow SUTD to partner Tamil Nadu universities to explore various student and faculty-related initiatives and programmes. The signatories were President of SUTD, Chong Tow Chong and MD of Guidance Tamil Nadu, Mr V. Vishnu.

And finally, an MOU between Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation (TNSDC) and the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) who are partnering in areas such as Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) consultancy, skill development and staff capability development.

In his closing remarks, SICCI's Chairman, Mr Neil Parekh said, 'the Tamil Nadu Investment Conclave has been a productive and insightful event where valuable ideas and perspectives were shared among the stakeholders. We have seen how Tamil Nadu can offer a wealth of opportunities for investors through the state's robust infrastructure, skilled workforce, and forward-thinking policies. The Conclave also served as a platform to discuss challenges and potential solutions towards achieving sustainable growth and development in Tamil Nadu. We hope that the connections and ideas exchanged during this event will bear fruit in the years to come and contribute to the state's overall prosperity'.
